

Mississippi Timber Price Report

1st Quarter 2024

April 15, 2024



The Mississippi Timber Price Report provides a picture of timber market activity showing regional and statewide stumpage prices for common forest products. This report should only be used as a guide to help individuals monitor timber market trends. The average price should not be applied as fair market value for a specific timber sale because many variables influence actual prices each landowner will receive. This report and historical timber prices are available by contacting your local county Extension office or at www.extension.msstate.edu/forestry/forest-economics/timber-prices.

How are prices obtained? This report used data from 56 timber sales conducted and reported across Mississippi during 1st quarter 2024. Reporters include forest product companies, logging contractors, consulting foresters, landowners, and other natural resource professionals.

Price Trends

The majority of Mississippi saw below normal rainfall during January and most of February, except the northeast region which was wetter. March saw more normal rainfall, with many local areas receiving higher than normal rain amounts. Steady demand for wood products and supply constraints across the nation factored into price increases this quarter. Housing starts decreased in January but increased in February, with building permits reaching their peak in February. The unemployment rate has increased in February. Mortgage rates held steady this quarter. Diesel and crude oil prices were up in the 1st quarter. Prices during the 2nd quarter should see slight increases due to normal weather patterns and as new mill expansions and openings start accepting deliveries. However, Mississippi still has an overabundant supply of standing timber, keeping stumpage prices in check.

The 1st quarter statewide stumpage prices for pine products are in Table 1 and hardwood products are in Table 2. Figures reflect six year statewide average price trends. Prices varied for some product classes across regions. Southern yellow pine dimensional lumber prices were up in the 1st quarter; however, the prices are stabilized back to pre-2020 level. The oversupply of standing timber across Mississippi continues to depress stumpage prices. The good news, companies continue to make progress on expansion and new mill construction projects. Many will begin production during 2024. This added production capacity will benefit many landowners within the procurement radius of those mills.








